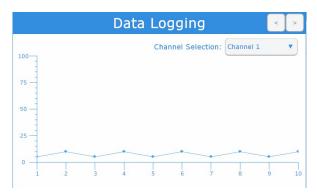

# **Template Overview**

This template has a Block trend graph to plot the data of array variables. The 5 sets of arrays is managed with visibility based on channel selection. Each channel has 10 int variables.

## **Project structure**

 On Screen1, 1 Content display (Layout Object) is placed with navigation switches at top to navigate between two contents.



- \*1- Click Switch1 to move from current screen to next screen.
- \*2- Click Switch2 to move from current screen to previous screen.

#### **Run Time Behavior**

Runtime/Simulation of this template displays trend graph of the configured array variable.

The "Channel Selection" drop-down in top of the screen is used to select the channel. This template has 5 channels.

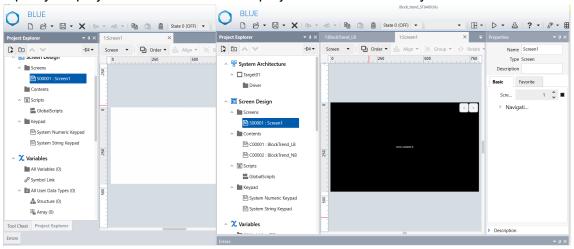
Depending on the selected channel, its corresponding variable value is plotted in the graph. Each channel has 10 variables.

Note: To load the simulation, some default value was given for each variable. (Modify the value as required)



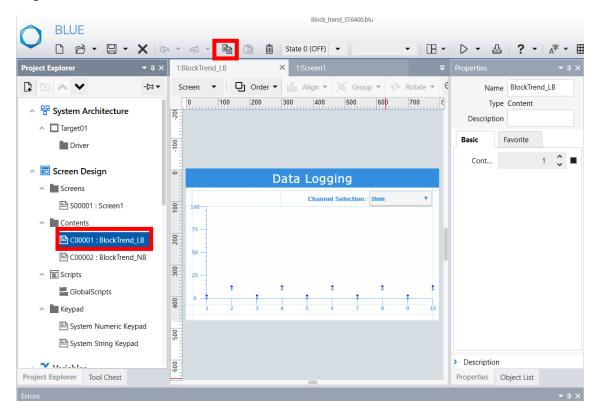
# How to copy the objects to your project file

1. Open your project file and downloaded project file simultaneously.



2. Open the downloaded project file.

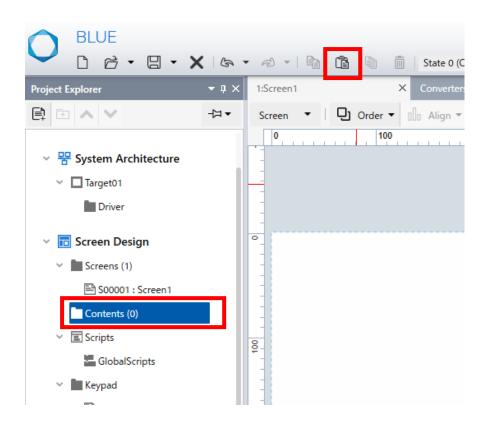
Click the desired Content from "Contents" and copy the content using copy icon in global Toolbar.



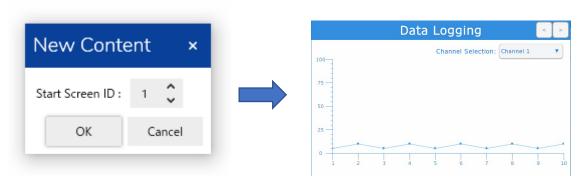
3. Open your project file.

Click "Contents" and paste icon in global Toolbar.

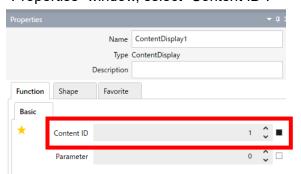




4. Select "Start Screen ID" and "OK". Copied content is successfully pasted in your project.



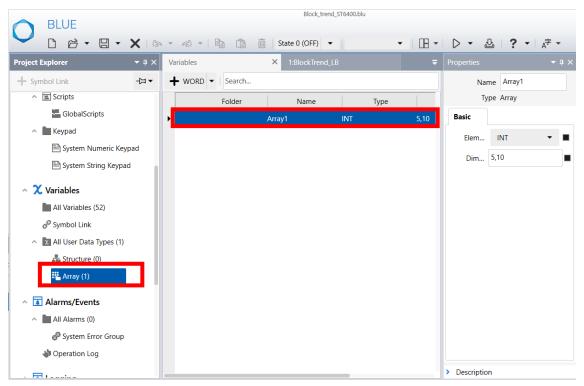
5. Select "Screen" and place "Content Display" Layout object from "Tool Chest". In "Properties" window, select "Content ID".





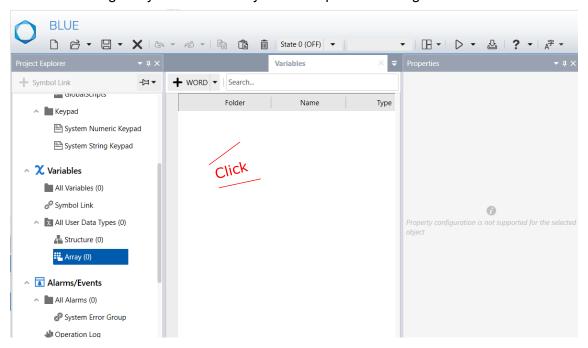
6. Open the downloaded project file.

Click an existing array or a blank array and click paste icon in global toolbar.



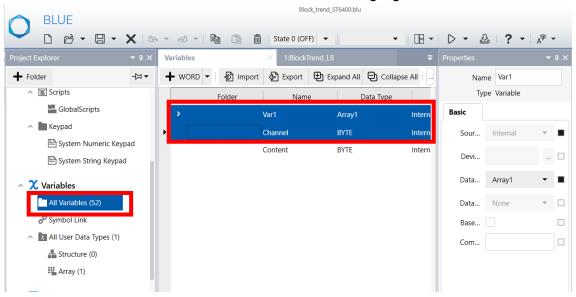
The copied array is pasted in your project.

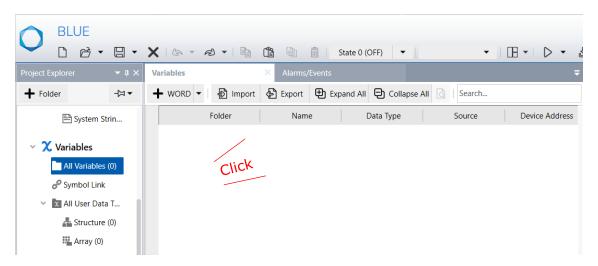
8. Open the downloaded project file.

Click an existing variable or a blank Variable and click paste icon in global toolbar.



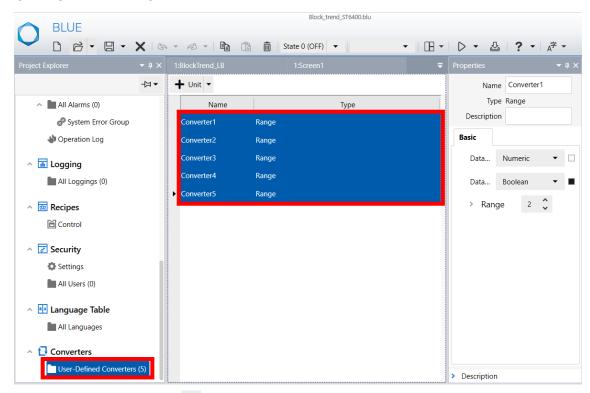
The copied variable is pasted in your project.

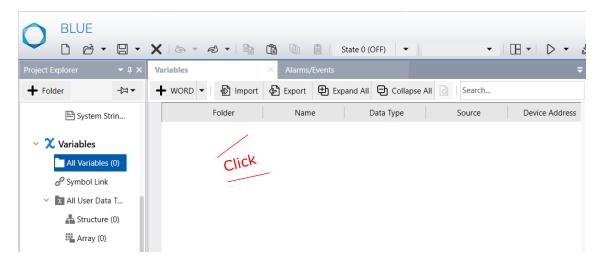


11. Open the downloaded project file.

  Click an existing converter or a blank converter and click paste icon in global toolbar.



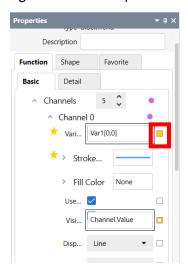
The copied variable is pasted in your project.



## How to change Block trend variable

If you create new variables, then it should be configured in block trend as shown below.

- I. Select Block Trend object in content.
- II. In "Properties" window, select Function>Basic>Channel0>Variable and click right side small square in Variable.



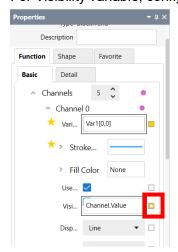
III. Select "Variable"
